
Victor Abram Bass

1888 - 1916

Victor Abram Bass was born in Chester, the son of Roger Bass and his wife Thomasina who was originally from Langport, Somerset

He served as a Private in the 20th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment).

Victor was killed in action in the Second Phase of the Battle of the Somme in High Wood, part of Delville Wood, near Longueval, France on the 20th July 1916 age 28.





Victor is Remembered with Honour on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France and in Winsford Church.

In the 1911 Census and on the Winsford Memorial he is referred to as Abram rather than Abraham.

Although little is known of Victor, on the 30th September 1916 a memorial service was held in Winsford Church in memory of both him, a pupil of the Vicar and of James Blake q.v. of Higher Spire.
