



Frederick Callaway

1886 - 1917

Frederick Callaway was born in Winsford in 1886, the son of Thomas and Elizabeth Callaway. One of six, he was the brother of Archibald and of Florence and worked at the Royal Oak in Winsford as a Hotel Groom.

A Private, he served in the 8th Battalion, Somerset Light Infantry. He was killed in action in the Battle of Broosseinde, part of the Passchendaele campaign near Ypres, Flanders on the 4th October 1917, aged 32.

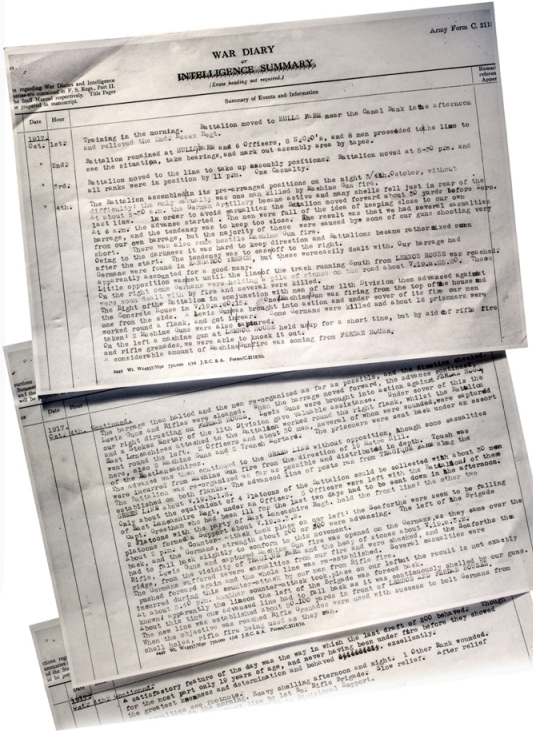
Remembered with Honour

Added to which, a younger brother Albert was soon to leave the family home to join the Gloucester Regiment.
