



Captain Wilmot Caulfeild MC Croix de Guerre

1887 -1980

Born in British Honduras Wilmot Caulfeild was commissioned into the Leinster Regiment in 1908. As adjutant of the 2nd Battalion he deployed from Cork on the 17th August 1914 to arrive in France on the 6th September. Wounded in 1916 he was evacuated to England returning to the Front 15 months later. Crossing into Germany in November 1918, he returned home a year later.

He was Mentioned in Despatches, on two occasions, in April and November 1916, "...for gallant and distinguished services in the Field". He was awarded the Croix de Guerre whilst attached to the French Fifth Army ".....for showing zeal and energy during operations in the valley of L'Ardre" in July 1918. His Military Cross was awarded when second in command of the 5th Battalion Duke of Wellington's Regiment "...distinguished himself as a leader throughout the advance and very especially in the fighting around Vaulx-Vraucourt, taking no account of personal danger or fatigue" 26th August 1918.

He is the maternal grandfather of David Godsall of Edbrooke House, Winsford.
