

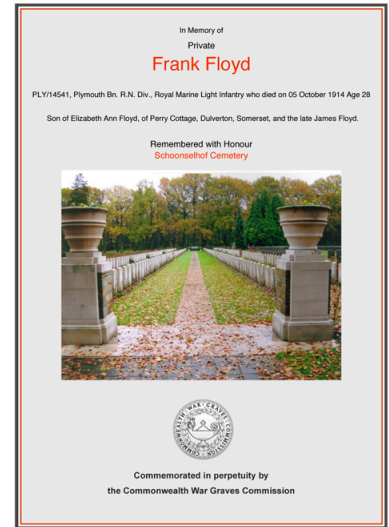


Frank Floyd

1890 - 1914

Frank Floyd was born in Dulverton on the 10th June 1890. the son of James and Elizabeth Floyd. He joined the Royal Marines Light Infantry as Private PLY/14541. Frank died on the 5th October 1914 age 28 as a direct result of enemy action during operations at Antwerp.

He is Remembered with Honour at the Antwerp Military Cemetary, Schoonselhof, Belgium.

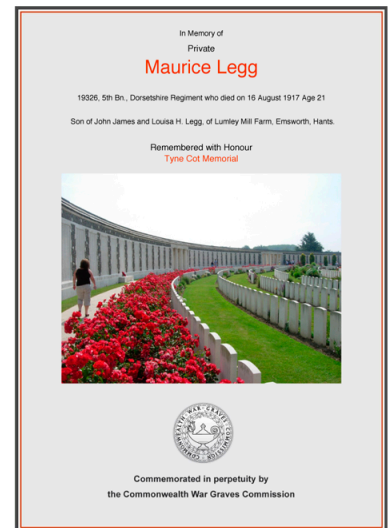


Maurice Joseph Legg

1897 - 1917

Younger brother of William Legg. Maurice attended Winsford School and worked as an assistant in the bakery. He joined the 5th Battalion Dorset Regiment and was killed in action on the 16th August 1917 age 21.

Maurice is Remembered with Honour at the Tyne Cott Memorial, Belgium.

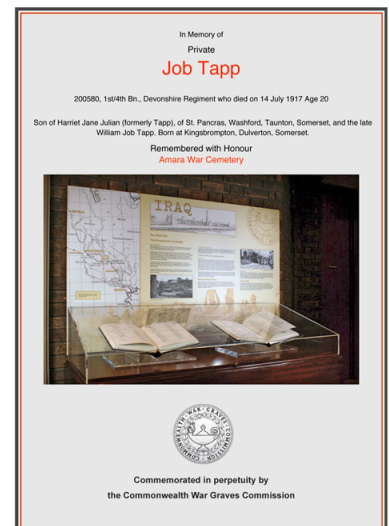


Job Tapp

1897 - 1917

Job Tapp was born in 1897 in Dulverton, the son of William and Harriet Tapp. From 1901 he lived at Upcott, Winsford. He joined the 1st/4th Battalion, Devonshire Regiment as Private 2198/200580. John died in Mesopotamia on 14th July 1917.

He is Remembered with Honour at the Amara War Cemetery, Iraq.



Little is known of the three names on this panel other than the fact that they all, at some time, attended Winsford School.

Their names appear on the School List of 'Those who Served Their King and Country'.

Sadly, all three lost their lives in WW1.
