

## Owen Vincent Le Bas

1894 - 1915

Owen Vincent Le Bas was born in Kensington, London in 1894, the son of Reginald Vincent, a barrister and Florence Le Bas and younger brother of Rainald Steven Le Bas. He was the uncle of Ann Le Bas who currently lives in Winsford.

Owen joined the 1st Battalion Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment as a 2nd Lieutenant and then the Royal Flying Corps. He gained his Flying Certificate at the British Flying School, Le Crotoy, France on the 29th April 1915.


He was killed in action less than seven months later on the 7th November 1915 near Douai, France age 21.
