Those associated with Winsford

Sidney Blake

1898 - 1964 Son of James and Margaret Blake of Wilway Farm Dulverton. A private in the 3rd Battalion Dorset Regiment. Discharged to West Nethercott in 1919 and died at Little Ash, Winsford in 1964.

Ross Arnold Brown

1888 - 1972 Chauffeur to the Myers family, Little Ham Winsford. He joined the 5th Northamptonshire Regiment as a private and later died on Exmoor in 1972.

John England

1894 - 1975 The father of Samuel and Arthur Gifford England of the Police House, Winsford. He served as a Bombadier in the Royal Regiment of Artillery. He died in Weston Super Mare in 1975 having lost his son Samuel in WW2.

Sidney Norman

Born 1898 Son of Thomas and Emily Norman of Little Withycombe. Winsford. He served with the 10th South Wales Borderers as a private.

Harry Egerton Norton

1877 - 1950 Born in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He served with the Imperial Yeomanry as 2nd Lieutenant and in 1901 joined the 15th Hussars. He served from 1914 to 1918 as a Major in the Southern Irish Horse and was wounded in action. He moved to Pittcott House in Winsford in 1938 and died in Minehead in 1950.

Alfred Ernest Snow

1898 - 1983 Commissioned into the Somerset Light Infantry in 1917 he served on the North West Frontier in 1919. As a Brigadier in WWII he took the surrender of the Germans in Jersey on 9th May 1945. He retired to Farm, Winsford.

Jack Stevens

1888 - 1948 Of East Nethercott Winsford. He is buried in Winsford Churchyard.
